Conditions of Entry

- Stewards reserve the right to alter classes if insufficient cattle are entered in a class
- Where possible, please include specific exhibits for Interbreed classes on the Entry Form.

ALL ENTRIES **MUST** BE ACCOMPANIED BY **COMPLETED**:

- **Personal Indemnity/Waiver Forms** for **ALL** adults & **ALL** children competing or in any way involved.
- **National Cattle Health Declaration**
- **National Cattle Vendor Declaration/Waybill**

- Age of cattle as at: **Friday 10th April, 2026**
- Entry Fee: **\$10 per exhibit**
- Late Entry Fee: **\$20 per exhibit**

Due to space restrictions, we encourage you to get you entries in as early as possible. Late entries can only be accepted IF there is room in sheds.

Entry fees and all paperwork to be lodged before 8.00am Saturday.

- **All cattle MUST:**
 - Be registered in the respective breed society herd book, led steer/heifer excepted.
 - Carry an NLIS device.
 - Be broken to lead. Nose clips or rings are compulsory for all cattle.
 - Bulls over 12 months **MUST** have a nose ring **AND** be secured with a neck strap.
 - **ALL** cattle must be secured by a halter **and** neck strap/collar when in the shed.
 - Meet an acceptable standard of behaviour/temperament otherwise they may be removed/disqualified by the Judge or Chief Steward.
 - Remain on site until completion of Show and participate in Grand Parade if safe to do so.

- **All competitors/exhibitors/paraders MUST:**
 - **complete a Personal Indemnity/Waiver form and lodge it with the Cattle Secretary prior to commencing cattle related activities. Wrist bands will then be issued that must be worn for the duration of the Show.**
 - understand that they enter at their own risk.
 - supply their own equipment and feed.
 - Cattle bedding will be supplied.
 - supply their own electrical equipment that has a current safety certificate from a registered electrician as required by law.
 - wear appropriate clothing. No thongs or joggers permitted while working with cattle.
 - Behave in an acceptable manner. Unacceptable behaviour or language may result in disqualification.
 - Leave their area clean and tidy with all rubbish placed in bins and manure removed and taken to the manure heap.
 - Lodge appeals in writing to the Chief Steward within one hour with a non-refundable \$50 fee. A Committee will then be appointed to hear the matter at its earliest convenience and the decision will be final. Should any exhibit be disqualified, any associated ribbon and/or prize is to be returned. The Committee will decide if the ribbon and/or prize is to be awarded to the runner up or not.
 - All perpetual trophies are to be returned to the Chief Steward by 28th February the following year.
- Schools and Colleges are eligible to participate.
- Children must be 15 years of age to lead a bull.
- No bulls permitted in Junior Paraders
- All exhibitors must ensure they are aware of their biosecurity obligations and comply with all biosecurity responsibilities.
- The Society is not liable for damage, loss, or death of any exhibit. Stock owners should secure their own insurance as needed.
- NO SMOKING is permitted in the cattle sheds and surrounds.
- Prize money to be collected and signed for by exhibitor/supervising adult at the completion of the Grand Parade.
